The 28th Commonwealth Speakers Conference was inaugurated

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that the true meaning of democracy in India is ensuring that benefits reach the last person. journey. In the final years of colonial rule, when India's independence was assured, the Constituent Assembly met in this very Central Hall. For almost 75 years after independence, this building served as India's Parliament, where many important decisions and discussions related to the country's future took place. Now, this historic site dedicated to democracy has been named Constitution House (Samvidhan Sadan). The Prime Minister said that this is the fourth time that the Conference of

Iranian airspace closed... Air India cancels three flights to the US



New Delhi: Indian airline Air India has cancelled approximately three flights to the United States due to the closure of Iranian airspace, and some services to Europe will also be delayed. A source associated with the airline said that about three flights – two from Delhi to New York and Newark, and one from Mumbai to New York – have been cancelled. The airline posted that due to the evolving situation in Iran, the subsequent closure of its airspace, and keeping passenger safety in mind, flights transiting the region are now using alternative routes, which may cause delays. The company said, "Some Air India flights are being cancelled as rerouting is not currently possible." Air India expressed regret for the inconvenience caused to passengers due to this unforeseen disruption. Air India uses Iranian airspace for its flights to the US and Europe, and the alternative route involves flying through Iraqi airspace.

BMC Elections: RSS Chief Bhagwat Casts Vote, Emphasizes Choosing the Right Candidate

Nagpur: Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat cast his vote in the Nagpur Municipal Corporation elections on Thursday. Bhagwat was among the early voters. Speaking to the media after casting his vote, he emphasized the importance of active participation in the democratic process and choosing the right candidate. The RSS chief said that opting for the 'None of the Above' (NOTA) option indirectly promotes undesirable candidates. Bhagwat arrived at the polling station in the Mahal area of Nagpur around 7:30 am and cast his vote. He appealed to voters to vote for a deserving candidate in the elections, keeping the public interest in mind. He said, "That's why the first thing I did today was to cast my vote." Regarding the None of the Above (NOTA) option available to voters in the elections, he said that NOTA means you reject everyone, and by doing so, we end up promoting someone whom nobody wants. He said that NOTA gives people an option to express their dissent, but it is better to vote for someone than not to vote at all.

ED seizes assets worth Rs 21.45 crore in Mahadev betting app case

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has taken major action in the Mahadev betting app case, seizing assets worth Rs 21.45 crore in Chhattisgarh. The agency took this action against an illegal betting and money laundering network. The ED says that this action is based on an investigation into a money laundering case linked to an illegal online betting syndicate. This syndicate was active in Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and other parts of the country. The seized assets include properties and investments derived from the proceeds of crime earned through illegal betting

Human Rights Commission takes cognizance of case involving a young man forced into bonded labor, seeks response within two weeks

New Delhi: The National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) has taken suo motu cognizance of a case involving a young man who was separated from his family at Bahadurgarh railway station and subsequently subjected to bonded labor and physical torture in Greater Noida. The Commission has issued notices to the concerned authorities in Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Bihar, seeking a response within two weeks. In a statement issued on Thursday, the NHRC said that based on media reports, it has taken suo motu cognizance of the incident and issued notices to the Chief Secretary and Director General of Police of Haryana, the Police Commissioner of Gautam Buddha Nagar in Uttar Pradesh.

Significant Drop in NEET PG Cut-off Before the Third Round

More than 18,000 postgraduate medical seats remain vacant after the second round of NEET PG counseling across the country. According to sources in the Ministry of Health, the reason for the vacant seats was not a lack of qualified doctors, but rather the high percentile criteria. The National Board of Examinations (NBE) has decided to lower the cut-off before the third round. Under the revised

criteria, the percentile for the reserved category has been reduced from 40 to 0, with the minimum marks changing from 235/800 to ~40. For general and EWS candidates, the qualifying percentile has been reduced from 50 to 7. For PwBD general candidates, it has been reduced from 45 to 5 percentile.



Four astronauts returning to Earth from the ISS due to illness

An unprecedented event has unfolded in the history of space science. For the first time, a medical evacuation is being conducted from space. Four astronauts have departed from the International Space Station for Earth. They are expected to land in the Pacific Ocean today, Thursday. This decision was made because one of the astronauts on the mission fell seriously ill, and his examination and treatment were not possible

On Wednesday, this spacecraft separated from the International Space Station and headed towards Earth. Four astronauts are on board, including two Americans, one Japanese, and one Russian. According to officials, the condition of one of the crew members suddenly deteriorated, forcing the mission to be cut short.

GODDA: A 3-member investigation team of the Jharkhand State Minority Commission, comprising the Commission's Vice Chairman Dr. Pranesh Solomon, member Mr. Ikrarul Hasan, and member Barkat Ali, reached the residence of the deceased Pappu Ansari's family in Ranipur, under Pathargama police station area. The team spoke with the deceased's wife Aisha Begum, brother, son, two daughters, and other family members, offering them solace and assuring them of all possible government assistance. The Commission's Vice Chairman, Dr. Pranesh Solomon, clearly stated that the criminals would not be spared under any circumstances. The police are continuously conducting raids to apprehend the culprits. Solomon said that strict action would be taken against the culprits under



the provisions of mob lynching and other relevant sections of the law. He also stated that a proposal is being put before the government to ensure appropriate compensation for the family. Earlier, the Minority Commission team, regarding this brutal mob lynching incident, held a meeting at the Godda Circuit House with the district administration and police administration to discuss the investigation of the case and to prevent the recurrence of such mob lynching incidents. They reviewed the investigation conducted so far. It was stated in the meeting that the government is very serious about this incident, and that the

guilty should not be spared, nor should any innocent person be implicated. The team requested the district administration to constitute a separate investigation team under the leadership of the Sub-Divisional Officer in addition to the police investigation, so that appropriate action can be taken. The Poraiyahat police station was instructed to submit a detailed three-month report to the commission, including details of the number of patrolling

police teams and their patrol areas each month, the steps taken to raise public awareness that taking the law into one's own hands is a crime and that mob lynching is a serious offense, and the number of meetings held each month regarding police-public coordination. Instructions were also given to investigate all aspects of this brutal mob lynching incident according to the law. The team visited the incident site in Matihani under Podaiyahat

police station and conducted an on-site investigation, questioning the villagers. They then went to Ranipur in the Pathargama police station area to meet the deceased's family. The Minority Commission team was accompanied by Additional Collector Ms. Premlata Murmu, Sub-Divisional Officer Baidyanath Oraon, Sub-Divisional Police Officer Mr. Ashok Priyadarshi, Deputy Superintendent of Police Mr. J.P.N. GODDA: A meeting of the district-level Steering/Monitoring Committee related to the PM Poshan (Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman) scheme was held in the auditorium of the Collectorate under the chairmanship of the District Magistrate-cum-Deputy Commissioner, Godda, Ms. Anjali Yadav, IAS. During the meeting, the Deputy Commissioner conducted a detailed review of the quality, regularity, and adherence to nutritional standards of the mid-day meal program in all government and aided schools of the district. She gave clear instructions that children should be provided with clean, nutritious food according to the prescribed

menu, and that any kind of negligence would not be tolerated. The Deputy Commissioner sought detailed information on the supply and storage of food grains in schools, the attendance of cooks/assistants, payment of honorarium, cleanliness of kitchens and utensils, and other related points. She instructed the concerned officers to conduct regular inspections in all schools and submit reports.

It was also directed in the meeting that handwashing facilities, clean drinking water, cleanliness of the kitchen, and strict adherence to the prescribed standards in food preparation should be ensured in all schools. Emphasis was also placed on conducting regular health check-ups and nutrition awareness activities for the children. The Deputy Commissioner said that the main objective of the PM Poshan scheme is to increase children's attendance, improve their nutritional status, and develop their interest in education. Better coordination among all the concerned departments is essential for its successful implementation. The meeting was attended by the District Education Officer, District Education Superintendent, District Supply Officer, Mr. Avinash Purendu (representative from the Health Department), concerned Block Education Officers, and other relevant officials.

Bhagalpur: A meeting was held at the Review Building in Bhagalpur to review and assess the progress of the aspirational blocks of Bhagalpur district (Jagdishpur, Pimpaini, Sabour, Sanhaura, and Sultanganj). The meeting was chaired by Mr. Praveen Ranjan, Director, Department of Finance, Government of India, who was deputed by NITI Aayog. At the meeting, District Magistrate Dr. Naval Kishore Choudhary, IAS, extended a warm welcome to him on the soil of Bhagalpur by presenting him with a plant. District



Planning Officer Mr. Monu Kumar presented a PowerPoint presentation, informing about the progress made since 2023 on the 40 different progress indicators set for all departments in all the blocks. He informed that NITI Aayog has created a total of 40 indicators for the aspirational blocks, based on whose progress the aspirational blocks can be brought to the level of normal blocks. In all five blocks of Bhagalpur district, almost 100% achievement has been made in several indicators. Almost 100% achievement has been made in all seven indicators set for the Health Department: antenatal check-ups, institutional deliveries, low birth weight, hypertension, diabetes control, and reduction in TB cases. In the past year 2024, a comprehensive campaign was conducted in these blocks, and all five blocks received gold medals for achieving 100% saturation in all six indicators (antenatal check-ups, screening

for hypertension and diabetes, soil health cards, supplementary nutrition for pregnant women, and Jeevika). Bhagalpur is the only district in India whose all five aspirational blocks have been awarded. Almost 100% achievement has also been made in the seven parameters set for nutrition. Mission-45 was

launched in Bhagalpur to transform severely malnourished children into normal children. This has been praised at the state and central levels. Bhagalpur's aspirational blocks have achieved remarkable progress in the 11 parameters set by the Education Department, five parameters of the Agriculture Department, five parameters of infrastructure, and parameters of social development. The Central Nodal Officer, Mr. Praveen Ranjan, appeared quite satisfied and appreciated the work done in Bhagalpur district. District Magistrate Dr. Naval Kishore Choudhary, IAS, also provided detailed information to the CPO regarding Mission 45 and the work done in the health sector in Bhagalpur. VBG Ram Ji is an important step towards making the country self-reliant: Manoj



Khunti: The Vikas Bharat Rozgar Guarantee Yojana (VBG Ram Ji) is an important step towards making the country fully self-reliant by 2047. The scheme aims to eliminate corruption and loot prevalent in MNREGA. BJP State General Secretary Manoj Singh stated this while addressing a press conference held at the District BJP office on Thursday. Manoj Singh said that MNREGA previously guaranteed 100 days of employment, but the new Act has increased this to 125 days. He stated that the Vikas Bharat Rozgar Guarantee Yojana is an important initiative towards empowering and empowering rural India. The scheme aims to provide assured employment at the local level to the poor, laborers, and unemployed families living in villages, thereby preventing migration and strengthening the rural economy. He said that under this scheme, priority is being given to public utility works in rural areas. These include construction of rural roads, water conservation, digging of ponds and reservoirs, agricultural works, cleanliness campaigns, tree plantation, and infrastructure development at the Panchayat level. These works not only provide employment to villagers but also build permanent assets in the villages. Under the Rural Bibi Ji Ram Ji scheme, every eligible family is provided with wage-based employment for a fixed period. Wages will be paid directly into bank accounts, ensuring transparency and eliminating the role of middlemen. This will increase the income of rural families and meet their daily needs.

Gaurav kidnapping case raises questions about law and order, demands for action

East Singhbhum: The kidnapping of Gaurav Gandhi (24), son of Adityapur's renowned industrialist Devang Gandhi,



has raised serious questions about the state's law and order situation, said area MLA Saryu Rai on Thursday. On Thursday, he released a video message about the incident, stating that he had spoken to the state DGP and SSP Piyush Pandey and demanded the immediate arrest of the perpetrators. Saryu Rai stated that this incident has created an atmosphere of fear not only among the business community but also among the general public, and that the government and district administration should take immediate action. Gaurav Gandhi is the son of Devang Gandhi, vice-president of the Adityapur Small Industries Association (ASIA). The kidnappers demanded a ransom of 5 crore from the family via internet calling. According to reports, on Tuesday, Devang Gandhi was busy in an important meeting at the Adityapur Auto Cluster. At that time, he received a WhatsApp call from an overseas number (+62-831-94765544), which he could not answer due to the meeting. When Devang Gandhi returned home at around 2 pm and tried to contact his son Gaurav, his phone was switched off. Upon investigation, it was discovered that Gaurav had neither reached the bank nor the company. Later, when Devang Gandhi read the message from the same foreign number, he learned of his son's kidnapping and a ransom demand. Initially, when the family suspected a kidnapping, the police began investigating it as a missing person case. However, after the ransom message and technical evidence surfaced, the Bistupur police swung into action and, based on the statement of Devang Gandhi, a resident of CH Area Inner Circle Road, filed an FIR against unknown kidnappers. Police have launched a massive operation to safely recover Gaurav Gandhi.

Ranchi: A program was organized at the Meteorological Center, Ranchi on Thursday to mark the completion of 151 years of service of the India Meteorological Department (IMD). A quiz competition was also organized for children during the program, and the winning children were awarded. On this occasion, scientists discussed in detail all the services provided by the Meteorological Center, Ranchi, including weather forecasts, information on heavy rainfall, hailstorms, cold and heat waves, dust storms, Nor'westers, snow, and tropical cyclones, as well as seasonal warnings and the successful operation of services for aviation, agriculture, irrigation, navigation, and offshore oil exploration. On the occasion, Abhishek Anand, the principal scientist of the Meteorological Center, gave a PowerPoint presentation to the children from Surendra Nath Centenary School, informing them about the various activities of the Meteorological Center. He also told the children about the department's various apps, Damini, Sachet, Meghdoot, and Mausam, and advised them on how to use them. The children visited various meteorological instruments (automatic weather station, radiosonde) and the surface observation observatory and saw demonstrations. They were also informed about the working methods of the department. Scientists and staff of the Meteorological Center were present at the program.

Cold wave likely to continue in Jharkhand till Basant Panchami

The cold wave is likely to continue in the state till Basant Panchami (January 23). After Basant Panchami, the cold wave is expected to subside, and both maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to rise. According to the Meteorological Department, temperature fluctuations are expected in the coming days. Several districts of the state are still in the grip of a severe cold wave. On Thursday, the minimum temperature recorded in Khunti was 2.7 degrees Celsius and in Daltonganj it was 3.7 degrees Celsius. The Meteorological Department has predicted a cold wave in the northwestern, central, and southern parts of the state. These districts include Garhwa, Palamu, Latehar, Chatra, Koderma, and Lohardaga in the northwestern part;



Ranchi, Khunti, Gumla, Ramgarh, Hazaribagh, and Bokaro in the central part; and East Singhbhum, West Singhbhum, Simdega, and Seraikela-Kharsawan in the southern part. Westerly winds are increasing the chill - Meanwhile, during the last 24 hours, the highest temperature recorded in the state was 28.8 degrees Celsius and the lowest was 2.7 degrees Celsius in Gumla. During this period, light fog prevailed in some places, and a cold wave situation was observed in some areas. According to the department,

cold winds (westerly winds) are blowing over Jharkhand from the northwest to the north. This is the reason why the cold is not subsiding in the state, and the chill persists. On Thursday, a severe cold was felt in Ranchi and surrounding areas due to the cold wave since morning. Despite bright sunshine, there was no feeling of warmth in the atmosphere. In the evening, people felt intense cold. On Thursday, the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded in Ranchi were 22.2 and 9 degrees Celsius respectively, in Jamshedpur 25.2 and 9.3 degrees, in Daltonganj 25.6 and 3.7 degrees, in Bokaro 23.5 and 6.1 degrees, in Chaibasa 28 and 7.8 degrees, in Khunti 23.9 and 2.7 degrees, in Lohardaga 22.9 and 6 degrees, in Latehar 17.8 and 6.9 degrees, and in Seraikela-Kharsawan 26.4 and 6.1 degrees Celsius.

JDU stages protest against corruption in Mango Municipal Corporation

The Janata Dal (United) (JDU) metropolitan unit organized a protest on Thursday against alleged irregularities, corruption, and problems affecting the general public in the Mango Municipal Corporation. Ranchi Police Arrives at ED Office to Investigate Assault Case Against Drinking Water Department Clerk

In Ranchi, the capital of Jharkhand, two Enforcement Directorate (ED) officials have been accused of assault by Santosh Kumar, a clerk in the Drinking Water Department. Following these allegations, a team from the Ranchi Police arrived at the ED office on Airport Road on Thursday morning to investigate the matter. It is noteworthy that Santosh Kumar, a resident of Upper Chutia, has made sensational allegations against ED Assistant Director (II) Prateek and Assistant Shubham, accusing them of summoning him to the office, assaulting him, causing a head injury, and attempting to destroy evidence. After Santosh Kumar filed a complaint, the police registered a case (Case No. 05/2026) at the Airport Police Station and have begun an investigation. According to the complaint filed by the victim, Santosh Kumar, he was



instructed to appear at the ED office in Hinoo at 10:00 AM on January 12, 2026. Santosh Kumar alleges that when he reached Assistant Director Prateek's office at around 1:35 PM, the officers present there began pressuring him to confess to the allegations. The complainant states that when Santosh Kumar refused to admit to the allegations, officers Prateek and Shubham verbally abused him and brutally assaulted him. The victim alleges that the officers launched a life-threatening attack on him, causing a severe head injury and

'Discussed evolving situation': Jaishankar speaks to Iran FM Araghchi; tensions mount in Middle East

Iran's foreign minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi on Wednesday held talks with external affairs minister S Jaishankar. EAM Jaishankar noted that the exchange focused on recent developments amid escalating tensions in Iran.

"Received a call from Iranian Foreign Minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi. We discussed the evolving situation in and around Iran," Jaishankar wrote on X.

The discussion came as India issued a fresh advisory urging all its nationals in Iran to leave the country using available means. The Indian embassy in Tehran asked students, pilgrims, businesspeople and tourists to depart via commercial flights, while advising those



who remain to exercise extreme caution and avoid areas affected by protests or demonstrations.

According to estimates, more than 10,000 Indians, including students, are currently living in Iran. The embassy also urged Indian citizens and Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) to stay in close contact with the mission, keep their travel

and immigration documents readily accessible, and ensure registration with the embassy.

"In view of the evolving situation in Iran, Indian nationals who are currently in Iran (students, pilgrims, business persons and tourists) are advised to leave Iran by available means of transport, including commercial flights," the

embassy said.

The advisory was issued amid mounting international alarm over Iran's security crackdown on nationwide protests. Rights groups say at least 2,586 people have been killed, making it the deadliest unrest the country has seen in decades.

The protests, which began late last month after the Iranian rial plunged to record lows, have spread to all 31 provinces and evolved from economic grievances into broader demands for political change. US President Donald Trump has warned of potential military action in response to the killings.

Former chief and tea vendor were shot in the firing

Palamu, Agency: Three rounds of gunfire erupted at a tea stall on Kandu Mohalla Gas Godown Road in the city police station area of ??Medinagar, the Palamu district headquarters, at 9 a.m. on Thursday. Former chief Naveen Prasad (45) was hit in the back, while a tea vendor, Ajit Kumar Gupta (52), was hit in the leg. Even after being shot, former chief Naveen fought the attacker and tried to snatch the pistol. Although unsuccessful, the attacker, seeing Naveen overpower him, fled the scene.

The youth has been identified as Golu Paswan, whose house is adjacent to the scene of the incident. Police are attempting to arrest him. Naveen Prasad has been admitted to a private hospital for better treatment, while the tea vendor is undergoing treatment at MMCH.

According to reports, former



chief Naveen Prasad was sitting at Ajit Prasad's tea stall. Suddenly, Golu Paswan arrived and fired a shot from behind.

One bullet hit Naveen Prasad in the back. However, Naveen Prasad immediately grabbed Golu Paswan's pistol and attempted to snatch it. A scuffle ensued. Two more rounds were fired from the pistol, one hitting the shopkeeper Ajit in the leg.

'Jana Nayagan' row: Setback for actor Vijay's film SC refuses to entertain plea for CBFC clearance

New Delhi, Agency: In a big setback to actor Vijay, the Supreme Court on Thursday refused to entertain a plea against an order of stay passed by a division bench of the Madras high court over the certification of his movie "Jana Nayagan".

The top court asked KVN production to raise its grievances before a division bench of the Madras HC, which is examining the issue.

A bench of Justices Deepankar Datta and AG Masih asked the Madras high court to decide the matter by January 20.

On January 9, the Madras high court stayed a single judge's order directing the Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC) to immediately grant a censor certificate to Jana Nayagan, leaving the fate of actor-turned-politician Vijay's film uncertain. KVN Productions LLP moved an appeal against the single judge's



directive, after a division bench of the high court last Friday put the order on hold and restrained the CBFC from issuing the certificate.

Vijay recently launched his political party, the Tamilaga Vettiri Kazhagam. "Jana Nayagan", widely projected as Vijay's final film before his full-time entry into politics, was scheduled for a Pongal release on January 9. However, the release hit last-minute hurdles after the CBFC

failed to issue certification in time. The division bench's order came hours after Justice P T Asha directed the CBFC to clear "Jana Nayagan", setting aside the film board's decision to refer the matter to a review committee.

Subsequently, the first bench comprising Chief Justice M M Shrivastava and Justice G Arul Murugan, acting on an appeal filed by the CBFC, granted an interim stay on the single judge's verdict.

Earlier, while allowing KVN Productions' plea seeking a direction to the CBFC to issue the censor certificate, Justice Asha held that once the board had decided to grant certification, the chairperson had no authority to refer the film to a review committee.

The film board immediately challenged the order before the division bench.

From Chabahar to Kashmir: Why chaos in Iran hurts India, benefits China & Pakistan

New Delhi, Agency: As protests driven by economic distress and political fatigue spread across Iranian cities, New Delhi is watching events unfold with quiet unease. For India, the question is not whether Iran's clerical leadership can weather the unrest, but what a weakened or collapsing Iranian state would mean for India's already constrained strategic environment.

India's engagement with Iran has never been ideological. It has been shaped by geography, access and balance. With Pakistan blocking overland routes to Afghanistan and Central Asia, Iran has long functioned as India's only viable western corridor. It has also acted as a counterweight to Pakistani influence in the region and as a stabilising pillar in India's carefully calibrated West

Asia policy, which seeks engagement across rival power blocs.

A sudden weakening or collapse of the Iranian state would not produce a clean transition. It would generate uncertainty at a moment when India's strategic room for manoeuvre is already narrowing — with Bangladesh in uncertainty with reports of minority killings, Pakistan being Pakistan, China expanding its footprint across the region and the US under Donald Trump hurtling the world into one crisis after another.

Any disruption in Iran would ripple outward, reshaping trade routes, diplomatic alignments and security calculations that India has spent decades managing.

For decades, Iran has served as

JNU professor Rajan Kumar in conversation with the Times of India says: "Iran remains India's most important land bridge to Central Asia, since Pakistan denies India access to overland routes." Even after the Taliban's return to power in Afghanistan and the stalling of rail projects due to sanctions, the logic of Chabahar has not disappeared. If anything, it has become more critical.

A regime change that leads to prolonged instability would place these projects in jeopardy. Connectivity corridors require politi-

cal coherence, security guarantees and long-term planning. As Kumar warns, "In a post-Khamenei power struggle, Chabahar risks becoming a hostage to instability rather than a strategic asset." For India, losing Iran as a stable transit partner would mean losing its only realistic access point to Central Asia.

How Iran historically balanced Pakistan's value to India has not only been geographic; it has also been strategic. Despite being a Muslim-majority country, Tehran has never aligned itself with Pakistan's anti-India narrative. On the contrary, Iran has consistently opposed Sunni extremist groups that threaten Shia populations — the very networks that have targeted Indian interests over the decades.

Today, our country is not just a nation that protects its geographical borders, but has become a powerful nation that demonstrates balanced power in all three dimensions: water, sky, and land. In the rapidly changing global landscape, India has transcended the traditional forms

of warfare and achieved mastery in cyber, space, and drone warfare. India has molded its military doctrine around the principle of "strength with restraint." This is why, while remaining a proponent of peace, India appears capable and decisive in responding to every challenge posed by an enemy who does not provoke anyone, and if provoked, does not spare them, entering their homes and striking. The security of Indians is the nation's top priority, and

therefore, coordination between the Army, Navy, and Air Force is no longer merely a practice, but a strategic necessity. Modern border surveillance systems, network-centric warfare, real-time intelligence sharing, and precision strike capabilities have enhanced India's deterrence manifold. India's preparedness on all three fronts, including rapid deployment in mountainous regions, security of sea lanes, and air-based rapid response, sends a clear message that any mis-

adventure will be met with immediate and effective response.

Indian national security is strengthened not only by weapons, but also by policy, diplomacy, and public confidence.

In recent years, India has strengthened its border security, improving its defense infrastructure, pursuing joint command initiatives, and enhancing strategic cooperation with friendly countries. A policy of "zero tolerance" towards threats such as ter-

rorism, cross-border infiltration, and piracy has strengthened India's security credibility.

It is clear that India does not seek war, but if war is imposed, its response will be decisive. A recent example is Operation Sindoora, in which Pakistan targeted several cities in the country, but the capabilities of our soldiers and military systems thwarted its nefarious designs.

The biggest pillar of India's military power is its indigenous defense technology.

Missiles like Agni and Prithvi, developed under the leadership of DRDO, the BrahMos supersonic cruise missile by BrahMos Aerospace, the indigenous Tejas fighter aircraft, the Dhruv helicopter manufactured by Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, the modern Akash air defense system, and the indigenous Arihant-class nuclear submarines have all been developed. All of these are powerful examples of India's self-reliant defense capability.

After the Iranian genocide

Iran is no longer witnessing a rebellion or revolt, but a genocide. One estimate puts the number of deaths at around 650, while Western media reports over 6,000. The so-called "revolutionary" Irfan has been sentenced to death. Iranian police have arrested or detained over 11,000 rebels. 1.5-1.8 million rebels are protesting in the streets. People are being burned alive. A colonel of Iran's Revolutionary Guards has been murdered by rebels. Mosques, banks, government buildings, and police stations have been burned. The governor's residence has also been targeted by arson. The Iranian government has issued orders to shoot rebels on sight. They could even face the death penalty. Despite these announcements, a mob of millions of young people is determined to overthrow Supreme Leader Khamenei. Khamenei supporters have also flooded the streets. The movement began against inflation, unemployment, economic collapse, and the collapsing currency, the rial, but it has now taken an international turn. US President Trump is constantly threatening the Iranian regime with the threat of an attack at any time. On one side is the US, and on the other, Iran is surrounded by superpowers like Russia and China. There were reports that Khamenei might flee to Moscow with his family and 20 close supporters, but he remains within a highly secure location in Iran, guarded by highly lethal forces. Iran is not Venezuela, so Trump should not be under any illusions. Iran possesses a powerful and trained military. It also possesses nuclear-capable missiles, a picture of which was shown in the media.

Animal rights vs. human safety

Stray dogs, human compassion, and public safety: The Supreme Court's strong comments and the global question facing India
Clear judicial guidelines, compensation framework and legal responsibility of dog feeders are the need of the hour to protect the elderly and children from stray dogs.
Dog Bite: The next hearing on January 20, 2026, is not just a date, but could be a crucial hearing for policymaking, accountability frameworks, and future direction.

The issue of stray dogs in India is not new, but after the Supreme Court hearing on January 13, 2026, the issue has become a serious matter of public safety, administrative accountability, and constitutional duty, not just a matter of love or compassion for animals. The Court's sharp observations have made it clear that this debate will no longer revolve around emotions, but will instead center on the right to life, state responsibility, and citizen security. When a nine-year-old child loses his life in a stray dog attack, it becomes not just an accident but a symbol of the state's failure, societal priorities, and policy-making weaknesses. In the January 13, 2026, hearing, the Supreme Court stated very clearly that if incidents of stray dog bites or attacks continue, state governments may have to pay substantial compensation in each case. Advocate Kishan Sanmukhdas Bhavani, Gondia, Maharashtra, believes this observation marks a turning point in India's judicial system. The Court also indicated that not only the government, but also individuals



and organizations that feed dogs in public places and then refuse to take responsibility for any consequences, can be held accountable. This approach highlights the judiciary's view that duty and rights cannot be viewed as separate from each other. The Supreme Court's most significant observation was that stray dogs are not the private property of any individual or organization. If they truly belong to someone, there can be no moral or legal right to release them onto public streets. The Court asked, "When dog-loving organizations or individuals feed dogs and protect them, why do they shirk responsibility in the event of a dog bite or death?" This question adds a new dimension to the debate on animal rights versus human safety, not just in India but worldwide.

Friends, if we consider the issue of "Children and the Elderly: The Most Vulnerable, the Most Neglected." During the hearing, the Supreme Court expressed deep concern about the safety of children and the elderly, particularly those who are vulnerable and neglected. The Court stated that these groups are unable to defend themselves or respond quickly in the event of an attack. When a child on their way to school, an elderly person on a morning walk, or a patient outside a hospital becomes a victim of stray dogs, it is not merely an accident but a violation of constitutional rights. The Court's remark, "Should this court close its eyes?" indicates that the judiciary no longer wishes to remain a neutral spectator on this issue. One of the Supreme Court's most scathing remarks was, "Are emotions only shown for dogs, not for humans?" This question exposes the double standards of Indian society, where protests over dog rights are immediate, but the deaths of children are not met with the same intensity. The Court made it clear that the value of human life cannot be less than that of any animal, even when the issue is sensitive. The Supreme Court bench stated unequivocally that if any individual or group wishes to feed or care for dogs, they should do so within their own home, premises, or compound. Releasing them on public roads, creating fear and increasing the risk of attack, and then evading responsibility, will no longer be acceptable. This observation is also significant from a global perspective, as in developed countries, pet ownership is mandated by legal responsibility.

Friends, if we consider the issue of administrative inaction versus law and order, the court clarified that this is not merely a matter of law and order, but of administrative inaction.

Compared to 2013, the number of elderly people looking for jobs at that time was only 43.6 percent. The Korea Employment Information Service stated that the analysis based on the survey has revealed surprising results. The need to earn money among the elderly is increasing. In the 10 years since 2013, the number of older adults seeking employment has jumped by 12.1 percent. This is a worrying statistic. This restriction applies to all users, including paid subscribers, X said in a post on its official 'Safety' handle.

Further, image creation and the ability to edit images via the Grok account on the X platform are now only available to paid subscribers.

"We now geoblock the ability of all users to generate images of real people in bikinis, underwear, and similar attire via the Grok account and in Grok in X in those jurisdictions where it's illegal," the post said.

X said it has implemented technological measures to prevent the



Grok account from allowing the editing of images of real people in revealing clothing, such as bikinis. "This restriction applies to all users, including paid subscribers," it added.

to change its existing safety

protocol that all AI prompts and generated content posted to X must strictly adhere to its stipulated rules. "However content is created or whether users are free or paid subscribers, our Safety team are working around the clock to add addi-

tional safeguards, take swift and decisive action to remove violating and illegal content, permanently suspend accounts where appropriate, and collaborate with local governments and law enforcement as necessary," X said.

X said it remains committed to providing a safe platform for everyone and continues to have zero tolerance for any forms of child sexual exploitation, non-consensual nudity, and unwanted sexual content. "We take action to remove high-priority violative content, including Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM) and non-consensual nudity, taking appropriate action against accounts that violate our X rules," the post said.

It added: "We also report accounts seeking Child Sexual Exploitation materials to law enforcement authorities as necessary."

Ledecky Makes History at Pro Swim Series, Records Second Fastest Time in 1500m Freestyle

Nine-time Olympic gold medalist Katie Ledecky of the United States once again proved her dominance, recording the second fastest time in history in the women's 1500-meter freestyle. She secured a resounding victory at the US Pro Swim Series in Austin, Texas, finishing in 15 minutes 23.21 seconds. Ledecky completely dominated the race, winning by more than a minute over 16-year-old Brinley Hanson. Hanson finished second with a time of 16:31.31, while Becca Mann came in third with 16:35.09. Although Ledecky couldn't break her own world record (15:20.48) set in 2018, she improved upon her previous second-best time of 15:24.51,

the only woman to have swum the 1500-meter freestyle in under 15:30 ten times. She holds the top 12 times and 24 of the top 25 times ever recorded in this event. Italy's Simona Quadarella's time of 15:31.79, which she set last year while finishing second to Ledecky at the World Championships, is now the 13th fastest time in history. In the men's 1500-meter freestyle, world record holder and Ledecky's training partner Bobby Finke won with a time of 15:01.70. Ireland's 800-meter Olympic champion Daniel Wiffen finished second in 15:04.98. In other events, Canadian Olympic star Summer McIntosh and France's Léon Marchand advanced to the finals of the 200-meter individual medley.

Australian Open 2026 Men's Draw: Sinner-Djokovic and Alcaraz-Zverev could clash in the semifinals

The men's singles draw for the Australian Open 2026 was released on Thursday during the draw ceremony held in Melbourne. Two-time defending champion Jannik Sinner and World No. 1 Carlos Alcaraz have started their campaigns with relatively easy matches, although the draw suggests high-voltage clashes between Sinner and Novak Djokovic, and Alcaraz and Alexander Zverev in the semifinals of the tournament. Two-time defending champion Sinner will face Hugo Gaston of France in the first round, while top seed Carlos Alcaraz will take on local Australian player Adam Walton. After the draw ceremony, Sinner said, "The draw is very tough, it doesn't matter who you play. We are the best players in the

world and it's a very long journey." 38-year-old Serbian legend Novak Djokovic will be aiming for a record 25th Grand Slam title. Playing in his 21st Australian Open, Djokovic will face Pedro Martinez (World No. 71) of Spain in the first round. Djokovic's first major test could come in the fourth round against 16th seed Jakub Mensik, who defeated Djokovic in the Miami Open final last year. Gallagher has played a total of 177 Premier League matches for Chelsea and Crystal Palace. He has also played on loan for Charlton Athletic, Swansea City and West Bromwich Albion. In August 2024, Gallagher

joined Atletico Madrid under the coaching of Diego Simeone, where he participated in 77 matches. His goal in 27 seconds against Real Madrid in the Champions League Round of 16 was historic. He became the first English player to score in a Madrid derby and it was also the fastest goal by an English player in the UEFA Champions League. Internationally, Gallagher has played 22 matches for England. He was also part of the England team for the 2022 FIFA World Cup and the 2024 UEFA European Championship. Gallagher's arrival at Tottenham is expected to strengthen the midfield, and the club's fans are hoping for a significant contribution from him.

AFCON 2025: Mane outshines Salah as Senegal defeat Egypt to reach the final

Thanks to a decisive 78th-minute goal from Sadio Mane, Senegal defeated Egypt 1-0 in the Africa Cup of Nations (AFCON) 2025 semi-final on Wednesday, securing their place in the final. With this victory, Mane gained the upper hand over his former Liverpool teammate and Egypt captain Mohamed Salah in this crucial match. After the match, the 33-year-old Mane revealed that this is his last Africa Cup of Nations tournament. He said, "I am very happy to have had the opportunity to play in my last AFCON. I will try to win the final and take the trophy back to Dakar." Former champions Senegal maintained greater possession against a cautious Egyptian team. Senegal will now face hosts Morocco in the final on Sunday. With this result, Senegal maintained their dominance over Egypt. The 'Teranga Lions' had also defeated Egypt in the 2022 AFCON final and the 2022 FIFA

World Cup play-offs. Both matches were decided by penalty shootouts. This will be Senegal's fourth appearance in the AFCON final. They previously lost to Cameroon in 2002 and Algeria in 2019, while they won the title in the 2021 edition (held in 2022) by defeating Egypt. Egypt captain Mohamed Salah was effectively contained by Senegal's strong defense throughout the match. This was Salah's fifth AFCON, and so far, he has come closest to winning the title by finishing as runner-up twice. Mane said, "From the beginning, we played as a team. We tried to avoid individual mistakes and unnecessary fouls. We managed the game well throughout and

overall deserved the win." He further added, "The most important thing for me is that Senegal wins every time. I am a soldier of the country and I try to give my best every day, whether it's training or a match. The Africa Cup of Nations is one of the toughest competitions in the world because all the teams are almost at the same level." Tense atmosphere, then peace returned - There were several tense moments between the two teams during the match. Senegal's experienced defender Kalidou Koulibaly received a yellow card in the 17th minute for fouling Egyptian striker Omar Marmoush. This was his second yellow card in as many consecutive matches, which means he will miss the final in Rabat. However, even worse news followed six minutes later when Koulibaly got injured and had to be replaced by Mamadou Sarr. In the first half, Senegal played aggressively but could not seriously challenge Egypt's 37-year-old goalkeeper Mohamed El-Shenawy.

BCB issues notice to director, BPL's first match postponed due to players' boycott

Cricinfo report, the Chattogram Royals and Noakhali Express teams, scheduled to play the first match of the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL), did not arrive at the ground until the scheduled start time, resulting in the match being postponed indefinitely. Furthermore, four first-class matches of the Dhaka Cricket League could not be held on Thursday. CWAB leaders have also announced that they will hold a press conference soon. Background of the controversy - The controversy began when Nazmul Islam reiterated his refusal to tour India for the T20 World Cup next month and dismissed the players' concerns regarding their remuneration.
